SFPA Background:

In accordance with Statutory Instrument No 376 of 2006 the Sea-Fisheries Protection Authority was established on the 1st of January 2007 as was provided for by the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006 (No. 8 of 2006). The Authority is independent in the exercise of its functions. The SFPA carries out a wide range of functions related to Sea-Fisheries conservation and Seafood Safety law including seafood consignment export certification, food operator business approval and registration, product approval and supporting the good reputation of Ireland's seafood industry through the implementation of Seafood safety legislation. The SFPA also performs a key role in shellfish sampling to support the production of safe shellfish by the Irish shellfish industry. The SFPA has a central role in the enforcement and verification of compliance with Sea-Fisheries legislation.

Principal Functions of the SFPA:

- To secure efficient and effective enforcement of sea-fisheries law and food safety law
- To promote compliance with and deter contraventions of sea-fisheries law and food safety law
- To detect contraventions of sea-fisheries law and food safety law
- To provide information to the sea-fisheries and seafood sectors on sea-fisheries law and food safety law and relevant matters within the remit of the Authority, through the Consultative Committee established under section 48 of the above Act or by any other means it considers appropriate
- To advise the Minister in relation to policy on effective implementation of sea-fisheries law and food safety law
- To provide assistance and information to the Minister in relation to the remit of the Authority
- To collect and report data in relation to sea-fisheries and food safety as required by the Minister and under Community law
- To represent or assist in the representation of the State at national, Community and international for a as requested by the Minister; and
- To engage in any other activities relating to the functions of the Authority as may be approved of by the Minister

Job Specification

The SFPA is seeking an Assistant Principal Officer as Executive Manager, Corporate Governance. This senior leadership position is a rewarding and challenging role for an individual who can demonstrate the ability to lead and manage the Corporate Governance arrangements of the Authority and the Corporate Affairs unit to achieve its intended outcomes and deliver a range of key services including compliance with governance obligations, internal and external communications, business & strategy reporting, risk management, FOI/PQ requests and data protection.

The post holder will ensure that SFPA's governance measures are undertaken to the highest standards of probity and according to legislative and code requirements. They will manage procedures for the sound corporate governance of SFPA and will advise the SFPA Authority and Management Board on related matters.

The position offers an opportunity for an ambitious, enthusiastic and committed professional with a strong commitment to serving the public interest, to influence and contribute to the development of the SFPA and support it in its role in protecting and conserving fisheries resources for long-term use; promoting compliance with sea-fisheries

The SFPA has a number of flexible and family friendly working policies in place, including a Blended Working Policy, which provides the opportunity to request a remote working arrangement. Under the Blended Working Policy there is a requirement to attend the office in Clonakilty 50% of working time.

Key Duties & Responsibilities

- Proactively manage compliance with the statutory and code of practice governance requirements of the SFPA.
- Lead on the execution, oversight and reporting on the SFPA Strategy 2024-2026.
- Provide leadership to all staff within his/her -area of responsibility to ensure delivery of targets and objectives set out in the Business Plan and SFPA Strategy by promoting teamwork and developing the capability of the team through mentoring and coaching.
- Support the work of the SFPA Audit & Risk Committee.
- Lead on organisational business planning and reporting processes for the organisation.
- Provide the Authority and the Management Board with information and reports on corporate affairs related areas as appropriate and any other such reports as may be required from time to time to facilitate executive decision making.
- Oversee the preparation of the Annual Report for submission and publication.
- Proactively engage with the SFPA Internal Audit function and oversee the operation, administration, and implementation of the SFPA Central Audit Tracker.
- The role holder will support the Chief Risk Officer in the effective implementation of SFPA Risk Management policy.
- Ensure SFPA compliance with key statutory obligations including data protection, freedom of information, sustainability reporting and protected disclosures.
- Perform the role of Data Officer as defined in the Data Sharing and Governance handbook.
- Responsibility for management of the Data Protection Officer function for the SFPA and those duties assigned to the DPO in the SFPA Data Protection Policy.
- Ensure that corporate policies and procedures are documented, updated and aligned with best practice and communicated to others.
- Support the Executive Chair fulfilling her/his Accountable Officer responsibilities with respect to good governance and to maintain the highest standards of prudence, propriety and regularity.
- Monitor changes to the legal framework within which the SFPA operates and provide guidance to the Authority, Management Board and Senior Management Team to ensure continued compliance with that framework.
- Report to the SFPA Authority and Management Board on the implementation and delivery of the Oversight and Performance and Delivery agreement.
- Manage internal staff and external suppliers to design, develop and deliver the SFPA's communications strategy.
- Report periodically on the implementation, and effectiveness of the SFPA's communications strategy.
- Oversee national promotional and awareness campaigns of SFPA through the provision of effective communication campaigns across a variety of channels.
- Oversee the creation and management of all internal and external communications content.
- Represent SFPA as required and develop effective partnerships with external stakeholders.

- Manage presence at outreach events, such as at trade shows and industry information session.

In addition to the duties outlined above, carry out any other relevant duties which may be assigned to him/her by SFPA Authority or Management Board from time to time.

Job Revision:

This job description is subject to periodic revision following discussion with the post-holder in order to meet future developments of the Sea Fisheries Protection Authority. It may include any other duties and responsibilities as determined by the Authority.

It is an absolute requirement that candidates declare any potential conflict of interest at the application stage of the recruitment process. Failure to declare such conflicts of interest which later come to light may result in the candidate being disqualified from the competition or, if the candidate is offered and takes up a role with the SFPA on the basis of misleading information may result in immediate dismissal from the SFPA.

Essential Requirements:

Candidates must meet the following essential requirements prior to the closing date of the competition:

- Possess a Business, Legal or Corporate Governance related Third Level qualification (minimum level 8).
- Possess at least five years' experience post-qualification professional experience in a Communications, Corporate Affairs, Corporate Governance or related field role.
- Some knowledge, of the 2016 Code of Practice for the Governance of State Bodies, GDPR Legislation, Law Enforcement Directive, Data Protection Act, Data Governance Act, Freedom of Information Act, AIE Act and the Protected Disclosures Act. A recognised qualification in any of these areas would be an advantage.
- Supervisory management and people management capability.
- The ability to deliver projects, utilising all available resources and securing the best outcomes based on strategic objectives
- Proven leadership and motivation skills together with the ability to allocate work to team members, set performance standards, evaluate work outputs from the team, foster accountability and address any issues of underperformance arising in relation to staff.

In addition to the minimum qualification entry requirements candidates must also have:

- Fluent spoken and written English
- Be prepared to carry out some business travel to offsite meetings and to SFPA port offices nationally if required.

Desirable Entry Requirements

- Possess a knowledge of the operational work of the Sea Fisheries Protection Authority.
- Possess a good working knowledge of the public service.
- Experience of managing Parliamentary Questions.

- Good knowledge of corporate governance best practice in the context of public sector organisations.
- Experience of advising an Executive Team on matters of governance, compliance and best practice.
- Knowledge and an interest in Parliamentary and Government Affairs.

Note: This job description should be regarded as an outline of the major areas of accountability at AP Level at the present time and will be reviewed and assessed on an ongoing basis.

Conditions of Service General

This appointment is to the Assistant Principal grade on a permanent contract and is subject to the Civil Service Regulations Acts 1956 to 2005, the Public Service Management (Recruitment and Appointments) Act 2004, the Sea-Fisheries and Maritime Jurisdiction Act 2006 (No. 8 of 2006) and any other Act for the time being in force relating to the Civil or Public Service.

Important Note

Candidates should note that entry will be at the minimum of the scale and the rate of remuneration may be adjusted from time to time in line with Government pay policy.

Candidates should note that different pay and conditions may apply if, immediately prior to appointment, the appointee is a serving civil or public servant.

Long service increments may be payable after 3 years (LSI-1) and 6 years (LSI-2) satisfactory service at the maximum of the scale. Increments are normally awarded annually subject to satisfactory performance and sick leave limits; however, payment of increments and or the rate of remuneration may be adjusted from time to time in line with Government pay policy.

Tenure

This is a permanent position. The appointee will be required to serve a 12-month probationary period.

Location

The appointee for this role will be based in SFPA, Clonakilty. Meetings may take place at locations around Ireland. When absent from home and place of employment on official duty, the appointee will be paid appropriate travelling expenses and subsistence allowances, subject to normal civil service regulations/public sector regulations.

Blended Working:

The Sea Fisheries Protection Authority is committed to embracing opportunities for remote and blended working, to build a more dynamic, agile and responsive Public Service, while sustaining strong standards of performance and high levels of productivity.

As an employer, SFPA operates a blended working policy that facilitates access to remote working options having regard to work-life balance/integration, mental health, and the need for a safe and productive working environment. Availability and patterns of blended working will be based on business needs and the suitability of the role may be subject to change should the business needs dictate. Currently, there is a requirement for office attendance 50% of working time.

Hours of attendance

Hours of attendance will be fixed from time to time but will amount to not less than 41 hours 15 minutes gross per week or 35 hours net per week. The appointee will be required to work such additional hours from time to time as may be reasonable and necessary for the proper performance of his/her duties subject to the limits set down in the working time regulations.

Rest Periods

The terms of the Organisation of Working Time Act, 1997 will apply to this appointment.

Annual Leave

In addition to the standard public holidays, the annual leave for this position is minimum 30 days per annum.

Sick Leave

Pay during properly certified sick absence, provided there is no evidence of permanent disability for service, will apply on a pro-rata basis, in accordance with the provisions of the sick leave circulars.

PRSI

Officers who will be paying Class A rate of PRSI will be required to sign a mandate authorising the Department of Social Protection to pay any benefits due under the Social Welfare Acts directly to the SFPA. Payment during illness will be subject to the officer making the necessary claims for social insurance benefit to the Department of Social Protection within the required time limits.

Outside Employment

The position is wholetime and the officer may not engage in private practice or be connected with any outside business, which would interfere with the performance of official duties.

Superannuation and Retirement

The successful candidate will be offered the appropriate superannuation terms and conditions as prevailing in the SFPA at the time of being offered an appointment. In general, and except for candidates who have worked in a pensionable (non-single scheme terms) public service job in the 26 weeks prior to appointment (see paragraph d below), this means being offered appointment based on membership of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme ("Single Scheme").

Key provisions attaching to membership of the Single Scheme are as follows:

Pensionable Age

The minimum age at which pension is payable is 66 (rising to 67 and 68) in line with State Pension age changes.

- a) **Retirement Age:** will be determined in accordance with the relevant government Departmental circulars.
- b) **Pension Abatement**
 - If the appointee was previously employed in the Civil Service and is in receipt of a pension from the Civil Service normal abatement rules will apply. However, if the appointee was previously employed in the Civil Service and awarded a pension under voluntary early retirement arrangements (other than the Incentivised Scheme of Early Retirement (ISER) or the Department of Health Circular 7/2010 VER/VRS which, as indicated above, renders a person ineligible for the competition) the entitlement to that pension will cease with effect from the date of reappointment. Special arrangements will, however, be made for the reckoning of previous service given by the appointee for the purpose of any future superannuation award for which the appointee may be eligible.
 - If the appointee was previously employed in the Civil Service or in the Public Service, please note that the Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and Other Provisions) Act 2012 includes a provision which extends abatement of pension for all Civil and Public Servants who are re-employed where a Public Service pension is in payment. This provision to apply abatement across the wider public service came into effect on 1 November 2012.
 - This may have pension implications for any person appointed to this position that is currently in receipt of a Civil or Public Service pension or has a preserved Civil or Public Service pension which will come into payment during his/her employment in this position.

Department of Education and Skills Early Retirement Scheme for Teachers Circular 102/2007

- The Department of Education and Skills introduced an Early Retirement Scheme for Teachers. It is a condition of the Early Retirement Scheme that with the exception of the situations set out in paragraphs 10.2 and 10.3 of the relevant circular documentation, and with those exceptions only, if a teacher accepts early retirement under Strands 1, 2 or 3 of this scheme and is subsequently employed in any capacity in any area of the public sector, payment of pension to that person under the scheme will immediately cease. Pension payments will, however, be resumed on the ceasing of such employment or on the person's 60th birthday, whichever is the later, but on resumption, the pension will be based on the person's actual reckonable service as a teacher (i.e. the added years previously granted will not be taken into account in the calculation of the pension payment).

Ill-Health Retirement

Please note that where an individual has retired from a Civil/Public Service body on the grounds of ill-health his/her pension from that employment may be subject to review in accordance with the rules of ill-health retirement within the pension scheme of that employment.

Prior Public Servants

While the default pension terms, as set out in the preceding paragraphs, consist of Single Scheme membership, this may not apply to certain appointees. Full details of the conditions governing whether or not a public servant is a Single Scheme member are given in the Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and other Provisions) Act 2012.

However, the key exception case (in the context of this competition and generally) is that a successful candidate who has worked in a pensionable (non-single scheme terms) capacity in the public service within 26 weeks of taking up appointment, would in general not become a member of the Single Scheme. In this case such a candidate would instead be offered membership of the pension scheme for non-established civil servants ("Non-Established State Employee Scheme"). This would mean that

the abatement provisions at (c) above would apply, and in addition there are implications in respect of pension accrual as outlined below:

Pension Accrual

A 40-year limit on total service that can be counted towards pension where a person has been a member of more than one existing public service pension scheme would apply. This 40-year limit, which is provided for in the Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and other Provisions) Act 2012 came into effect on 28 July 2012. This may have implications for any appointee who has acquired pension rights in a previous public service employment.

Pension-Related Deduction

This appointment is subject to the pension-related deduction in accordance with the Financial Emergency Measure in the Public Interest Act 2009.

The above represents the principal conditions of service and is not intended to be the comprehensive list of all terms and conditions of employment which will be set out in the employment contract to be agreed with the successful candidates.

The Selection Process

How to Apply

To apply, candidates must provide an up to date Application Form and submit their application form via the online application portal.

Selection Process

The Selection Process may include the following:

- Submission of Application Form
- Aptitude Testing
- Technical Knowledge or Skills based exercise
- Shortlisting of candidates based on the information contained in their Application Form
- Initial/preliminary interview
- Presentation or other exercises
- A final competitive interview
- Any other tests or exercises that may be deemed appropriate

Shortlisting

Normally the number of applications received for a position exceeds that required to fill existing and future vacancies to the position. While you may meet the eligibility requirements of the competition, if the numbers applying for the position are such that it would not be practical to interview everyone, Sigmar Recruitment Consultants Ltd. may decide that a smaller number of applicants will only be called to interview.

In this respect, Sigmar Recruitment Consultants Ltd. provide for the employment of a short-listing process to select a group for interview who, based on an examination of the application forms appear to be the most suitable for the position. Order of Merit

After offering the successful candidate the position the Authority may form an order of merit from which future similar vacancies may be filled during the life of the panel; such a panel will remain active for a maximum period of 12 months. Only candidates that pass the competency interview and meet the interview boards qualifying score may be included in the order of merit.

Temporary Vacancies

In the event that temporary vacancies for this post arise during the lifetime of the Order of Merit, the SFPA reserve the right to offer such temporary posts on the basis of the results of this competition. Candidates who accept such a temporary post retain their placing on the Order of Merit and the acceptance of such a temporary appointment in no way interferes with the normal process of appointing candidates to permanent posts that may arise.

Confidentiality

Subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2014 applications will be treated in strictest confidence.

Security Clearance

Garda vetting may be sought in respect of individuals who come under consideration for appointment. The applicant will be required to complete and return a Garda vetting form should they come under consideration for appointment. This form will be forwarded to An Garda Síochána for security checks on all Irish and Northern Irish addresses at which they resided. If unsuccessful

This information will be destroyed by Sigmar Recruitment. If the applicant subsequently comes under consideration for another position, they will be required to supply this information again.

Other Important Information

Candidates' Rights - Review Procedures in relation to the Selection Process
